Bills presented by Jim Corrie

Bills were approved.

There was a total of 127 calls for the month.

EMPG- all documentation was turned in for quarter five hopefully funds released by July.

Right now, we have about a 10% recovery rate on billing. Talked about possibility of a new company. Also redoing the way reports are completed.

Reapplied for the COVID-19 money. The quote has been denied twice. Readjustment made for full reimbursement. Did file for full waiting on approval.

More information is required for the GATA Audit.

Spoke with Mason County about paramedics. They are short as well and the option of sharing has many legalities and would require being employed by their company. Will be able to help in each other's district if necessary. Will email again about joining ICC for the paramedic classes. Class will be held by zoom meetings for the most part and hands-on clinicals at either Mason or Schuyler and Peoria hospitals.

Looking into a new ambulance would still be at least 1-2 yrs. out. For a van it would be 3-4 years for them to build and for a mini box it would be 1-2 years. New units require full payment before building. Buying something through Alexis would be a little more expensive but would not require full payment upfront. Will talk to Alexis again to see what they have to offer.

Discussion about the possibility of updating radios. More information on radios is needed.
